2011 Goals

1. Ensure that students continue to move into the exemplary level as measured by PASS and HSAP standardized tests.
 - Display MAP results (as well as other indicators of student achievement) on data walls; use data to predict success on standardized tests and to individualize instruction for each student.
 - Use 100 Book Challenge reporting system to monitor student reading levels.
 - Monitor software usage and prescribe individualized instruction using appropriate programs (Odyssey, PLATO, Read 180, TestView, etc.).
 - Utilize science and math kits to promote inquiry-based thinking through hands-on manipulation.
 - Employ standards-based lessons and differentiated instruction.
 - Utilize formative assessment strategies to improve instruction and enhance learning.
 - Incorporate Response-to-Intervention strategies to assist students who are at risk in order to increase student achievement.
2. Ensure that 80% of students achieve MAP growth in ELA and math as indicated in fall to spring MAP administrations.
 - MAP tests will be given in grades one through eight to measure growth.
 - Target growth scores will serve as the ultimate growth indicator.
3. Maintain district accreditation.
 - Comply with SACS standards and provide yearly updates to strategic plan.
4. Update and extend long-range facilities plan each year.
 - Complete one last project in Phase 2 and continue Phase 3 of the long-range facilities plan.
5. Promote and support opportunities for students to be successful in post-secondary situations.
 - SAT/ACT scores will show improvement from previous years in an effort to reach and exceed the national average for composite scores.
 - Dual Credit offerings at higher institutions will be reviewed.
 - Advanced Placement success rate will be analyzed.
 - Scholars Academy participation will be evaluated; accomplishments will be reviewed.
 - Early College participation will be evaluated; accomplishments will be reviewed.
 - Scholarship totals will increase from previous year.
 - Graduation rate will increase from previous year.
 - Dropout rate will decrease from previous year.
